Chris Poteat, CISA

What you will learn:

Enterprises today face a plethora of State and Federal requirements that can result in severe consequences and penalties should an audit result in major exceptions. This presentation will discuss using PCI/DSS as a foundation for risk assessments that are designed to help organizations understand the effectiveness of their current security program. The end game for all of these requirements is to evaluate the ability of the organization to protect sensitive data from unauthorized access or disclosure.

The Data Security Standard was developed by the Payment Card Industry to provide a concise framework to use in securing data captured during credit card processing. This framework, unlike others, provides a complete toolkit for the assessor that includes an easily understood description of the control and tests that should be performed to evaluate its implementation. Controls and tests are based for the most part on ISO Standard 27001 and best practices in the industry. Additionally, the standard contains a section for acceptable compensatory controls that can be used where prescribed controls cannot be applied for legitimate business reasons. As such, the standard provides a perfect opportunity for application to a larger population than the credit card processing community.

Besides the PCI/DSS, the presentation will address other tools and strategies that may prove useful in performing risk assessments and evaluations in preparation for compliance audits.

+ Governance, Risk & Compliance (GRC) is more than the latest buzzword, it has become the mantra of anyone trying to get a handle on IT spending, IT information security, and conversely, IT agility. The latest budget crisis has led to "across the board" cuts in every IT department without regard for which IT areas could actually help to substantially reduce costs. To earn the credential through the grandfathering program, an applicant must provide evidence of at least eight (8) years of IT or business experience with a minimum of six (6) years of cumulative work experience across all 5 CRISC domains and a minimum of three (3) years of cumulative work experience in CRISC risk domains 1, 2 and 3 (as defined and described by the CRISC job practice domains and task statements). Certification under the Grandfathering program is open to highly experienced professionals from April 2010 through March 2011.
