SC Midlands Chapter of ISACA Scholarship Recipient

On September 17, 2010, School of Accounting Chair, Brad Tuttle, presented Summer Rippy with a check from the Information Systems Audit and Control Association



Mike's presentation contained statistics about the number of security incidents that occur each year. The number of incidents is significant and should not be ignored. Risk management is a business problem.

Payment Card Industry/Data Security Standards (PCI/DSS) was introduced 2006 by the PCI Security Standards Council. It's a set of comprehensive requirements for enhancing data security. Documentation and other details can be found at www.pcisecuritystandards.org.

Many organizations need to be PCI complaint because they process credit card transactions; however, Mike suggested that to protect sensitive data the security standards should be adopted by all organizations (i.e. used as a framework for risk assessment).

A few highlights:

- Data Security Standards can be used for all systems that have "sensitive data" not just "credit card data"
- PCI/DSS follows accepted best practice security frameworks (e.g. ISO 27001)
- Other frameworks such as COBIT and ITIL can be used to fill the gaps
- Six controls areas developed by the Payment Card Industry are:

1. Build and Maintain a Secure Network
2. Protect Sensitive Data
3. Develop and Maintain a Vulnerability Management Program
4. Implement Strong Access Control Measures
5. Regularly Monitor and Test Networks
6. Maintain an Information Security Policy

explained that they couldn't personally pick it up but a shipper would arrive after they had paid in full. They needed my address and phone number to issue the payment. The next email apologized and explained that the secretary had mistakenly overpaid me with a check for \$2500, not \$200, and would I kindly deposit the check, keep \$300 for my efforts, and send a check for the remainder. My instincts (as an auditor of course) kicked in with some real suspicion at this point. Lo and behold, the \$2500 check arrived (delivered by the USPS at the cost of \$17.40 prepaid) after which I began to "audit" the check. The bank routing code was legitimate and the company did exist but it wasn't a certified or cashier's check. I set the check aside and then received another email directing me to send the overage to a specific person at a Wisconsin address. Googling the address, I got several hits on that name and address as a known scam collection site. My suspicions now confirmed, I proceeded to get two phone calls from a private caller pleading with me to do the deal because they so desperately needed that furniture.

Needless to say, this deal never got done and has been reported to Craigslist. No response so far. My next step is to record it on the FBI website. This weird episode led me to wonder how many cooperative people would have "kindly" done the deal. Obviously, quite a few or the cyber criminals wouldn't go to these lengths to scam the public.

CRISC Grandfathering



Professionals with 8 or more years of IT or business experience can now earn ISACA's new CRISC designation under its grandfathering program.

This program is designed to recognize experienced professionals who are responsible for:

- + Risk identification, assessment and evaluation
- + Risk response
- + Risk monitoring
- + IS control design and implementation
- + IS control monitoring and maintenance

To earn the credential through the grandfathering program, an applicant must provide evidence of at least eight (8) years of IT or business experience with a minimum of six (6) years of cumulative work experience across all 5 CRISC domains and a minimum of three (3) years of cumulative work experience in CRISC risk domains 1, 2 and 3 (as defined and described by the CRISC job practice domains and task statements). Certification under the Grandfathering program is open to highly experienced professionals from April 2010 through March 2011.
