This Month's Seminar:

Unifying Compliance and Risk Management

With the widening number of policies and regulations, organizations face an increasing number of compliance requirements from state and federal agencies, customers and suppliers, and even credit card companies. Setting-up their initial compliance and control processes has been time-consuming and labor intensive for most organizations, and they are just now beginning to realize the full significance and cost of their compliance programs. In fact, analysts predict that spending for compliance programs will top \$15 billion in 2006. This realization is driving the need for a unified approach to multiple compliance objectives and the use of automation. This presentation will discuss this emerging trend of "unified compliance".

Securing VoIP Networks

The convergence of voice and data networks brings new security vulnerabilities and redefines existing network threats. Organizations are challenged to adjust their current network security policies to include VoIP security. This presentation will focus on protecting the network from the most worrisome threat scenarios, including denial of service attacks, viruses, eavesdropping and toll fraud. This includes monitoring the VoIP environment to detect security threats, correlating and logging security events for audits, automated alerts for potential attacks, and performing forensic reporting to analyze call usage patterns and identify potential abuse.
